Play and Stay receives positive reaction

The new 'Marketing the Game' initiative, Tennis...Play and Stay received a very positive reaction from the 80 delegates that attended the Tennis...Play and Stay Seminar at The Queens Club in London on 26-27 February. Among those in attendance were manufacturers and representatives of coaching bodies, the Tennis Industry Association, ATP and WTA. Overall 28 nations were represented, including all four Grand Slam nations, while delegates from four regional associations were also in attendance.

The Tennis...Play and Stay campaign, which promotes tennis as easy, fun and healthy, involves over 30 major nations and organisations getting behind a worldwide drive to increase tennis participation. The initiative will be officially launched at the ITF AGM in Tunis on 20-22 June.

The campaign centres around the slogan of 'serve, rally and score' and aims to improve the way that coaches introduce tennis to starter players both young and old.

After opening speeches by ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti, and LTA President Stuart Smith, the ITF's Development Director, Dave Miley, summarised the key messages of the campaign:

- Tennis is easy and fun...provided coaches working with starter players use red, orange and green balls
- Starter players should serve, rally and score from the first lesson
- Tennis competition can be fun...formats and scoring systems exist to suit all lifestyles
- Tennis is healthy...research conducted by the ITF proves this
- Tennis is a sport for all...all players should have an ITN rating

The ITF's Mark Tennant gave an on-court presentation entitled 'Tennis is Easy and Fun' and was supported by guest presentations on successful initiatives from participating nations. The main message was that using slower balls, a number of which are available through manufacturers, with starter players is a crucial element of the campaign. By using these balls on an appropriate sized court, starter players have more time and more control, making the game easier and more fun.

Further presentations on competition, equipment distribution, marketing & promotion and the health benefits of tennis were given by ITF staff, participating nations and organisations.

Olympic Tennis Centre on track

John James and Eiichi Kawatei, the ITF's technical delegates for the Beijing Olympic Games tennis event, declared themselves satisfied with the progress of the Olympic Tennis Centre following a visit to Beijing last week.

Accompanied by officials of the Beijing Organizing Committee (BOCOG), the two technical delegates surveyed the Olympic Green Tennis Centre, which will host the Olympic and Paralympic tennis events in 2008.

The main cement structure of the central competition court has been topped off and the cement works on the main structure of No. 1 and No. 2 courts have been completed. In total, the Centre will boast ten match courts, six practice courts and will have a seating capacity of 17,400.

John James, who is also President of Tennis Europe expressed his belief that it would be an excellent venue, attractive both to spectators and sportsmen. "We hope that this sports facility will be fully used even after the Olympic Games are over, to leave a precious legacy to Beijing," he said.

Tennis Canada announces \$1m investment

Tennis Canada has announced a landmark \$1 million annual investment increase for high performance development in Canada. The funds will be directed towards three major components, highlighted by the creation of a full time live-in national training centre in Montreal and a start-up centre in Toronto. Increased concentration will be made towards under-12 player development and additional support will be targeted towards prospects making the transition from junior to professional tennis.

The milestone decision follows the recruiting of world renown tennis leaders Louis Borfiga and Bob Brett in 2006. Borfiga, vice president high performance, athlete development, will also serve as director for both Canadian national training centres and guide top juniors making the transition to the professional game. As Tennis Canada high performance consultant, Brett will be responsible for building a strong base of under-12 players in collaboration with club leaders and provincial association partners.

Tennis Canada Chair Jack Graham said, "Tennis Canada has taken a bold step towards reaching long-term international success. With the addition of a full time live-in national training centre, Canada's top tennis players will be given special opportunities that are shared by only the foremost sport nations. This is a banner day for tennis in our country."

"Tennis Canada has made an important step with the creation of a new national training centre," said Francesco Ricci Bitti, president, International Tennis Federation. "The ITF applauds this initiative that will allow Canada to realize its full tennis potential. It is vital that national federations follow Tennis Canada's example and become more involved in the development of the game in their countries." Obituaries: Bill Threlfall and David Berger

The ITF was saddened to learn of the deaths of tennis commentator, coach and player Bill Threlfall and also former International Tennis Hall of Fame board member David Berger.

Bill Threlfall, who died on 7 March at the age of 81, worked for ITV, BBC and Sky Sports during his long career and commented on 41 Wimbledons, both on radio and on TV. His most recent commentary came from the ATP event in Rotterdam in late February.

A former pilot in the Royal Navy, Threlfall won a record eight Royal Navy men's singles titles and five National Veterans' titles, most recently in 2004. He represented Great Britain as a player, as well as competing at Wimbledon in the 1950's. He began coaching in 1967 and coached at London's Hurlingham Club for the past 25 years.

ITF President Francesco Ricci Bitti said, "the ITF worked closely with Bill during his time at Sky Sports and he will be sadly missed by both ITF and the tennis family."

American David Berger, who died of pneumonia on 22 February, was a Board member of the International Tennis Hall of Fame from 1995 to 2001. As a lawyer, he was best-known as a pioneer of class-action lawsuits.

Indonesian and Japanese appeals

At its recent meeting in Delhi, India, the ITF Board of Directors heard an appeal from the Indonesian Tennis Association, regarding the cancellation of its 2006 World Group II Play-off tie against Israel.

The following was decided:

1. The fine imposed for Indonesia's withdrawal was halved to US\$2,500.
2. The full compensation for expenses incurred to be paid to the Israel Tennis Association would stand.
3. The full compensation for expenses incurred to be paid to the ITF would stand.
4. Indonesia would remain suspended from the 2007 Fed Cup competition
5. Indonesia will be allowed to return to the competition in Asia/Oceania Group I rather than Group II as originally decided.

At the same meeting, the fine given to the Japan Tennis Association by the ITF Junior Competitions Committee for non-compliance with Team Identification was reduced to US\$1,000 on appeal.
